Purpose of consultancy:	Evaluate the coverage and quality of the National Civil Registration and Vital Statistics System and the consistency of ethnic and racial variables for specific Latin American and Caribbean countries				
	Background Administrative records are documents produced by official government bodies to promote services, legal records and social rights. From these records, statistics can be produced for multiple purposes.				
	Strong civil registration and vital statistics (CRVS) systems provide a vital pillar to the robust national and sub-national population data systems needed for development. Unlike other sources of vital statistics, such as population censuses and household surveys, data from Civil Registration and Vital Statistics (CRVS) systems permit the routine production of statistics on population dynamics and cause of death on a continuous basis for the country as a whole, and for local administrative subdivisions.				
	UNFPA implements a life-course approach to CRVS support - from birth to death, including marriage and divorce - ensuring that a person's legal identity is progressively updated over the life course. A life-course approach advances human rights principles and inclusive development strategies for official statistics and public accountability, as shown below. Civil registration and legal identity facilitate access to health care, primary and secondary education, and social support.				
	UNFPA has been an engaged partner to UN Regional Economic Commissions in Africa, Asia and the Pacific, Latin America and the Caribbean, and Arab States in supporting regional programs in CRVS strengthening. In 2021 the Centre of Excellence on CRVS transitioned to UNFPA to expand the Centre's reach through UNFPA's global network with activities in over 150 countries. This consultancy will provide one of the important pillars for action in CRVS that relates to the diagnosis of the coverage and quality of registers in Latin America and the Caribbean, in addition to specific analysis of the consistency of				

	the ethnic-racial variable in countries that rely on the information to identify areas for future investments.
